





MOROCCO IN FOCUS AT EFM 2026 PROGRAMME



MOROCCAN CINEMA: A MOSAIC OF STORIES MADE OF LIGHT

A mosaic in which each fragment, each gaze, and each voice compose the pluralistic image of a country with multiple identities, rich in cultural diversity and intertwined memories.

Here, light is never just a simple backdrop. It sculpts faces, passes through landscapes, reveals silences, and accompanies stories. It illuminates a country steeped in history, both ancient and contemporary, whose cinema captures its rhythms, heritage, and metamorphoses. Each film becomes a fragment of a story, a stone added to the living mosaic that is Morocco.

Driven by an emerging generation of filmmakers and creators, Moroccan cinema is daring to try new approaches, exploring unexpected paths, and building bridges between territories, languages, and imaginations.

This artistic effervescence is supported by a film industry that is already solidly structured: a network of highly qualified technicians, experienced production companies, committed institutions, and internationally recognized expertise. This professional network makes Morocco not only a land of stories but also a genuine platform of creation and production, capable of supporting both local talent and large-scale international projects.

The Kingdom has established itself as an attractive hub for international co-productions and film shoots, supported in particular by a 30% cash rebate system, co-production accords with numerous countries, and support mechanisms dedicated to emerging talent, laying the foundations for a demanding and universal cinema.

This vitality is now finding particular resonance on the international stage. Selected as Country in Focus at the 2026 European Film Market in Berlin, Morocco is asserting its position as a crossroads between Africa, the Arab world, and Europe. Its long-standing presence at the Berlinale and EFM is a testament to its strong ties with the international film industry and the growing recognition of Moroccan talent and storytelling.

Highlighting Moroccan cinema means celebrating a mosaic of stories made of light but also a sector that is constantly evolving and looking to the future. It means affirming that in Morocco, cinema is both an art of encounter and an industry of creation and transmission, where the past dialogues with the future, and where each film, each collaboration, each project sheds a little more light on the collective narrative.

BIO: After completing her studies in English literature at Hassan II University in Casablanca, Ilham Raouf began working for Moroccan production companies as a production coordinator. She has worked on "Game of Thrones", "Homeland", "The Bureau", "Paris" by Cédric Klapisch, "Of Gods and Men" by Xavier Beauvois, and "Queen of the Desert" by Werner Herzog.

In 2012, Ilham Raouf and Jean-David founded Abel Aflam. She supports filmmakers in their creative process. She develops documentaries that reflect the social, political, and cultural situation in Morocco, such as "Mothers" by Myriam Bakir, "The Unbeloved" by Amina Harar and Mark Lautal, and "Fatna, A Woman Named Rachid" by Hélène Harder.

Abel Aflam founded in 2012 in Casablanca by Jean-David and Ilham Raouf, Abel Aflam produces and co-produces fiction films and documentaries, including "HOPE" by Boris Lojkine; winner of the SACD Award at the Critics' Week of the Cannes Film Festival in 2014, "Mothers" by Myriam Bakir; screened at IDFA 2020, "Clebs" by Halima Ouardiri; winner of the Crystal Bear for Best Short Film at the Berlinale 2020, and "Fatna, A Woman Named Rachid"; selected at FIFM 2025 in the Horizons section. In the age of social media and within a rapidly evolving Moroccan society, Abel Aflam shifts attention to new narrative forms and emerging platforms, while preserving its strong cinematic standards.

BIO: "Adios Carmen" (2013), a feature-length fiction film, enjoyed widespread international success and won numerous awards, including a Special Jury Mention at the Dubai International Film Festival, the First Film Award at the Tangier National Film Festival, the Grand Prize at Écrans Noirs (Cameroon), the Screenplay Award at FESPACO in Khouribga, and the Audience Award at the Brussels Mediterranean Film Festival. "Le Passage" (2025) is a feature film currently in post-production. "Qui es-tu ?" is a feature film currently in development.



Azir Productions, based in Tetouan, was founded in 2013 with the ambition of bridging between Africa and Europe through cinema. The company was one of the majority co-producers of the internationally awarded feature film "Adios Carmen". Open to both fiction and documentary, Azir Productions develops projects rooted in the social and human realities of northern Morocco, while maintaining a strong international outlook and high artistic standards. The feature film "Le Passage" (2025), shot between Morocco and Spain, marked a decisive step for the company and strengthened its experience in transnational collaboration with European partners. With the new project "Who Are You?", Azir Productions aims to continue and deepen this international trajectory.



BIO: Born in Tangier in 1972, Karim Debbagh discovered cinema at an early age alongside his friend and mentor, American writer Paul Bowles. After studying English literature in Tetouan, he joined the Filmakademie in Ludwigsburg, Germany, where he obtained his degree in production. In 2005, he founded Kasbah Films, now one of Morocco's leading production companies. He has collaborated on major international productions shot in Morocco, including *"The Wheel of Time"*, *"Men in Black: International"*, and *"A Hologram for the King"*. As a producer, he has been involved in several notable Moroccan films, such as *"The Damned Don't Cry"* by Fyzal Boulifa, *"Life suits me well!"* by Al Hadi Ulad Mohand, and *"Traitors"* by Sean Gullette.

Kasbah Films founded in 2005 in Tangier by Karim Debbagh, Kasbah Films is today one of the most recognized production companies in Morocco. The company supports Moroccan and international auteur cinema, while also providing executive production services for major foreign productions filmed in Morocco. Among its productions are *"The Damned Don't Cry"* by Fyzal Boulifa; featured in the Official Selection of the Venice Film Festival 2022 and awarded multiple international prizes, *"Life Suits Me Well!"* by Al Hadi Ulad Mohand; winner of the Grand Jury Prize at the Tangier National Film Festival 2022 and selected for Rotterdam 2021, as well as *"Traitors"* by Sean Gullette; selected at the Marrakech and Tribeca film festivals and awarded at several international festivals.

BIO: Khadija Alami is an award-winning Moroccan producer and a leading figure in international film and television production. She is the Founder and CEO of K Films and Kay Films LLC, and the Owner of Oasis Studios Morocco. Khadija Alami produced feature films, documentaries, and short films. Her extensive credits include acclaimed films and series. In 2017, Khadija Alami joined the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, becoming the first Arab woman producer and the second Moroccan filmmaker to receive this distinction. She is serving as Vice Chair of the Academy's International Committee, contributing to the Academy's global outreach and international engagement.

K Films history begins with Khadija Alami, who founded it in 1998 to offer production services for national and international production companies. K Films produces feature films, documentaries and short films, as well as being a trusted service company to international partners from all over the world.

She has collaborated with filmmakers such as Oliver Laxe, Hicham Lasri, Narjiss Nejjar, Bálint Kenyeres, and Simone Bitton, fostering creativity and pushing narrative boundaries. Lamia is a member of Film Independent, EAVE, and the ACE Networks. She is also the founder of the Tamayouz Foundation, dedicated to empowering women in Morocco's film industry through workshops, scholarships, and mentorship programs.

La Prod founded in 2007 in Casablanca by producer Lamia Chraibi, La Prod is one of Morocco's leading independent production companies. It supports bold and uncompromising cinema and series, rooted in the region while open to the world. Since its inception, La Prod has championed filmmakers with singular voices, fostering strong artistic partnerships and international co-productions. The company has worked with key European partners and its films have screened at major festivals including Cannes, Berlinale, Locarno, Toronto, Venice, Sitges, IDFA, and TIFF. Today, La Prod continues to expand into high-end series, exploring ambitious narratives across genres.

BIO: A graduate of HEC Paris and in film studies, Oumayma began her career in media consulting before turning her attention to production. In 2019, she created the podcast *9addat* to share the stories of inspiring women. She then participated in the Ludwigsburg-Paris Workshop and founded May Studio to support young talents. She produced the short film "L'mina" by Randa Maroufi, which won the Leitz Ciné Discovery Award at the 64th Critics' Week at the Cannes Film Festival. In 2025, she joined the second cohort of Tamayouz Atelier Pro at the foundation of the same name, where she supported Ayoub Lahnoud's project "Road to Limbo", teaming up with Fatima Boubakdy (Seven Shots) to produce this ambitious esoteric thriller.

Seven Shots founded in 2017, Seven Shots is a Moroccan production company dedicated to developing and producing authentic fiction rooted in Moroccan reality while having universal appeal. It supports writers and directors in creating unique stories, with the ambition of becoming a key player in independent production in Morocco and Africa. To achieve this, it draws on the more than 20 years of expertise of its founder, Fatima Boubakdy, in writing, directing, and audiovisual production, as well as on a solid network of technicians and long-term partners.





A Word from Narjiss Nejjar

(Director of the Moroccan Cinematheque)
The *Mirage* (*Assarab*) by Ahmed Bouanani is a dark fable. It tells the story of a poor man who discovers a bundle of banknotes hidden in a sack of flour and attempts to turn chance into destiny. Bouanani constructs this trajectory as a promise of ascent that ultimately collapses into disillusion—brutal and without redemption.

What is striking is that "chance" is never a simple narrative device; it becomes a social revealer. *Mirage* lays bare a country caught between the imaginaries that sustain it and the realities that refute them. In the Morocco of the 1970s—a period marked by social tensions—the found money does not liberate; it exposes. It attracts predation, activates hierarchies, and reveals the violence of thresholds. This is also why the film asserts itself as a form of "national allegory": an oblique and poetic way of speaking about the country.

Poet and editor, Bouanani makes films as one writes: through ellipses, blocks,

and rhythms. The narrative slips, doubles back, and becomes infused with orality, literature, and collective memory; the city turns into a moral labyrinth as much as a real space. This formal singularity—experimental without being gratuitous—has made *Mirage* a landmark of Moroccan cinema: a unique film (his only feature), inviting the spectator to get lost rather than to "consume" a story.

It is in this spirit that the Moroccan Cinematheque, in partnership with the CCM (Moroccan Cinema Center), undertook the restoration of this film: not only to preserve a rare work, but to make Ahmed Bouanani visible once again, and to restore him to his rightful place—that of a filmmaker who raised the shot to the level of a unit of thought, allowing reality to surface without ever seeking to illustrate it, while sharply underlining the central question he poses: What becomes of a man when a promise is placed in his hands, only to dissolve into a mirage?

Synopsis

After serendipitously finding a bundle of money, a poor villager tries his luck in the big city. There, he encounters a range of people also hoping for a better life – preachers, soothsayers, jugglers. A seminal work of post-colonial Moroccan cinema.



About the restoration

The selection of *Mirage* for Berlinale Classics is both a source of joy and a powerful statement. A cinephile joy—because this major work returns to the world within a framework fully committed to heritage cinema, and because it does so in a newly restored version, presented here in its world premiere. A gesture of recognition, too, because *Mirage* is not revisited as a curiosity, but reconsidered as a film of *mise en scène*, a poetics of ellipsis, and a critical dispositif. In choosing it, the Berlinale also affirms this: the film belongs to the great history of cinema, not merely to a national one.

This restoration was carried out from beginning to end under our direct responsibility: the responsibility of the gaze, of choices, of method,

of rigor. Choosing not to outsource the restoration process was not an act of rupture, but one of maturity.

To assume—here in Morocco—the entire chain that allows a work to become legible and transmissible again, on a continent where so many films disappear, is to open a field of possibilities: that of technical sovereignty in the service of cultural sovereignty. It means that we do not merely produce our own narratives, but that we are also capable of ensuring their preservation for future generations, by holding to the same principle throughout: fidelity to the film and respect for its materiality.




